Remembrance Sunday

Below is the message Fr Sean sent out by email on Wednesday, for those of you that didn't receive it.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Here we go again! Even though the evidence that our Covid-secure churches were contributing to the spread of the virus was sketchy at best, we are now officially obliged to suspend all public liturgical celebrations. The only liturgy permitted between now and December 2nd will be funerals with only close friends and family in attendance and with a maximum of 30 people present. It is sad that this Eucharistic fast is being imposed upon you once again but the Lord will not allow anybody who desires Him to be deprived of His grace. Please continue to make your daily acts of spiritual communion and you can be sure that Jesus will draw near in a special way.

I will be celebrating one private Mass per day during this time. As an initial plan I would like to continue to live-stream the Masses which take place in St Chad's at the scheduled times on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays. We already have people tuning in for these Masses from all over the UK, Ireland, and even from the USA, and it would be a shame to change these Mass times and cause confusion. (We are still so grateful to the *incredibly generous* anonymous benefactor who paid for the installation of this high-tech webcam as well as the first three years of its usage costs. Prayers for you and your family!)

I would like to convert all of the scheduled Mass times in St Ann's into private prayer times (although we are allowed only 10 worshippers at a time in the church again). This will demand no significant disruption of

the already established routine of the stewards who must be present whenever the church is open. The times for private prayer will be as follows:

9:45 - 10:45am on Mondays, Tuesdays, Fridays.

4:45 - 5:45pm on Saturdays.

10:45 to 11:45am on Sundays.

I will continue to offer a private Mass in St Ann's on Mondays and Fridays shortly after private prayer ends at about 11am. These changes take effect from the morning of November 5th. For the moment we have no private prayer times scheduled in St Chad's, but over the next week or two I will be in touch with the stewards and we can make a plan as to when we might be able to arrange some.

Let us offer up this trial in a spirit of sacrifice for all those who are suffering because of the pandemic and let us continue to pray for safety and protection for all.
