**Attention all Gift Aid Donors:** The tax year 2020/21 will end on 5<sup>th</sup> April and the Parish will then undertake the process of claiming back the Gift Aid refunds on donations made in the tax year. If your circumstances have changed and you no longer pay income tax (or if for any other reason you do not wish to remain in the Gift Aid Scheme) please contact Mary McPeake on 0161 432 3284 or by e-mail: [m.mcpeake@btinternet.com](mailto:m.mcpeake@btinternet.com) by 5<sup>th</sup> April, otherwise it will be assumed you have paid sufficient income tax for the Parish to reclaim Gift Aid on donations made in the tax year.

As an *indication* for each £1 per week that you donate through Gift Aid, you must have paid £13 per year in income tax; for each £5 per month that you donate through Gift Aid you must have paid £15 in income tax. Additionally, if you are in the Gift Aid scheme and have moved house in the last year, please will you contact Mary McPeake.

### Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> March – Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Dear brother and sisters in Christ,

As we approach the holiest of all weeks in the Catholic year, I wanted to remind you about the nine-day novena to the Divine Mercy which begins on Good Friday in anticipation of Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter Sunday). Divine Mercy Sunday came about as a result of the mystical experiences granted to Saint Faustina Kowalska. The Lord made known to her his desire for this feast and promised extraordinary graces to those who would celebrate it.

Here are the words which St Faustina recorded in her diary as having been addressed to her by Jesus himself:

**“Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy. (...) I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet.”**

It is generally understood that it is sufficient for a person to go to Confession in the weeks before the feast in order to obtain the special graces which the Lord grants on that day. What is essential is to make sure to be in a state of grace on the day itself. Some have likened the grace promised on Divine Mercy Sunday to the grace of Baptism which completely renews the soul and purifies her in such a way that she would go straight to heaven were she to die just afterwards. It would be wise to listen to the message of this great saint. We have nothing to lose and everything to gain.

Jesus also taught her to pray the “Chaplet of Divine Mercy” which is now recited daily at 3pm by millions of Catholics around the world, using rosary beads. It only takes a few minutes to pray but also comes with the promise of

eternal blessings. I have provided you with a prayer card with this week's newsletter which explains both the novena and the chaplet. We are especially urged to pray the chaplet for the dying, and if possible, in their presence. Jesus said:

**“Say unceasingly the chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it, they will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation...”**

**“It pleases me to grant everything souls ask of me by saying the chaplet. When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one. Write this for the benefit of distressed souls; when a soul sees and realises the gravity of its sins, when the whole abyss of the misery into which it immersed itself is displayed before its eyes, let it not despair, but with trust, let it throw itself into the arms of My mercy, as a child into the arms of its beloved mother... Write that when they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Saviour.”**
