## The Catholic Parish of St Chad, Cheadle Priest: Fr. Sean Davidson



Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2021 – 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This week we conclude our meditations on the virtues. The third and final theological virtue is the virtue of love or supernatural charity. We call it supernatural because it refers to the love that is put into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. There are many different forms of love in the world (love of family, romantic love, friendship, love of animals, love of country, love of chocolate etc...) but theological love is love for God and love of neighbour for God's sake. It is the work of the Holy Spirit within us and allows us to transcend our natural capacities for love. The Catechism describes it: "Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbour as ourselves for the love of God." (CCC 1822) Loving God for His own sake means not just praying because we need help, or trying to avoid sin just because of its negative consequences in this life and the next, but genuinely trying to please God because He deserves to be loved. I always found the act of contrition in French to be very beautiful, as it asks for forgiveness from God because He is "infinitely loveable" and so worthy of our love. "The practice of the moral life animated by charity gives to the Christian the spiritual freedom of the children of God. He no longer stands before God as a slave, in servile fear, or as a mercenary looking for wages, but as a son responding to the love of Him who first loved us." (CCC 1828)

The theological virtue of love is always exercised in relation to God, and thus it entails not only concern for the material well-being of others but also concern for their spiritual well-being. It is because Christian love is directed not only towards temporal happiness but also towards eternal happiness that it is often misunderstood by the world. We are concerned for the eternal salvation of people's souls, and so at times we have to warn them that taking a certain path puts their salvation in danger. From the purely worldly perspective this can appear as judgmentalism, but it is not. Rather it is true charity, seeking true and lasting happiness for the person in question. At times, we have to risk offending a person in order to truly help him. It is not charitable to wave and smile at a person who is about to walk into some grave danger, when we could have done something to warn him about it. The same is true in the spiritual order. The fruits of living an authentically charitable life under the influence of the Holy Spirit are joy and peace. (CCC 1829) There is nobody more joyful or peaceful than a saint who has lived for love alone. If ever we find we are lacking joy and peace, then a renewed effort to reach out and help God's children may be just the spiritual remedy we need.
