Sunday 12th December 2021 – 3rd Sunday of Advent Year C

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The word Advent comes from the Latin word for "coming." In Advent, we prepare our hearts to relive Christ's first coming to us in Bethlehem. We also confess our sins and amend our lives, so as to make sure that we are ready for His second coming to judge the living and the dead one day. In the first coming He came in gentleness and silence. He came that we might find forgiveness for our sins and be restored to intimacy with God. In the second coming, He will come with power and majesty, and He will reveal how each soul responded to the gifts of grace He brought us in His first coming. What have we done with that treasure of grace He bequeathed to His Church?

During the season of Advent, we honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in a special way. When Christ first came into the world, Our Lady's role was indispensable. Before St Joseph was let in on the secret. Mary was the only one who knew about Christ's conception by the power of the Holy Spirit. During that nine month "advent" when she carried Him in her womb, she surrounded Him with love at every moment. In the name of all humanity, she gave the Son of God the welcome He deserved. During Advent we have some great Marian feast days. Last Wednesday, we celebrated her Immaculate Conception, renewing our faith in the fact that she was conceived without sin and full of grace, so as to be a worthy mother of the Lord. On Thursday we remembered St Juan Diego, the visionary who saw her in Guadalupe. Then on Friday we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Loreto, during which we pondered the hidden life of Mary with Jesus and Joseph in the humble home of Nazareth. The Litany of Loreto gives Mary the lovely titles of Refuge of Sinners, Mother of Hope, Mystical Rose, Ark of the Covenant... Pope Francis recently added the title of "Solace of Migrants" to that litany of praise and petition. We entrust to her prayers all those who leave their homelands in search of a better life, sometimes facing great perils along the way. Let us also entrust to her prayers each day our parish and all of our loved ones. I conclude with the last couple of verses of a nice hymn that I used for vespers on the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception:

Hail, Mother most pure, hail, Virgin renowned, Hail, Queen with the stars as a diadem crowned; Above all the angels in glory untold, Set next to the King in a vesture of gold.

These praises and prayers we lay at thy feet, O Virgin of virgins, O Mary most sweet: Be thou our true guide through this pilgrimage here, And stand by our side when our death draweth near.
