Sunday 30th January 2022 – 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I know a priest who was once asked if it would be alright to play the song, *My Way*, at a Requiem Mass. You might think that it should go without saying that only sacred music should be played in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, but this is not always self-evident to those who haven't been practicing their faith regularly. I grant that the pop music of the 1960's was generally a little more tasteful than much of the pop music of the 1990's - when I was growing up - but pop music is still pop music. If we consent to subjecting the sacred space of the church to the pop music that was dear to those who came of age in the 1960's, then, in justice, we would also have to be ready to accept the pop music of the 1990's too. God forbid that we should ever end up with the Spice Girls or Oasis for the recessional hymn at a Requiem Mass!

In addition to the fact that we should only play church music in church, there is another problem with playing a song whose refrain is, "I did it my way" in the House of God. Catchy though it may be - and ideal for karaoke - if you really think about the lyrics, you will come to the conclusion that it is the one song which the saints in heaven are certainly not singing as they look back over their earthly lives (if such a thing can even be done in heaven). The problem that runs through the Bible from start to finish is self-will rebelling against God's Will. The first sin we read about in Genesis - in figurative language - is one of this kind. They were told in the simplest possible terms the only thing that they were not to do, and that was the one thing they ended up doing. The scope of their freedom was immense, but this was not enough for them. They thought they knew better than God, and so they chose to do it "their way." The rest is sorrowful fallen history. From the original sin to the last sins that will ever be committed, it is always the same story: self-will defying the Divine Will.

There is no holiness possible until we realise that because of our moral weakness we cannot always do whatever we feel like doing. The path to union with God begins when I accept that "my way" is often the wrong way. Only when we have been long schooled by grace will "my way" and God's Way finally coalesce, but deep purification is necessary before then. CS Lewis was so insistent that stubborn self-will prevents us from entering heaven that he wrote: "There are only two kinds of people in the end: those who say to God, "Thy will be done," and those to whom God says, in the end, "Thy will be done."
