Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

During Holy Week, we will be pondering with love all that Christ suffered during his Passion. Just after the luminous mystery of the institution of the Eucharist, Jesus crosses the Kidron valley and enters into a garden at the foot of the Mount of Olives, and there begins the sorrowful mysteries that save the world. The garden was called Gethsemane which means "olive press." It was the place in which the olives would be crushed to make olive oil. In that garden the soul of Jesus would be so utterly crushed by anxiety that St Luke could say: "Being in anguish he prayed more earnestly and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground." (Luke 22:44) I know very little about it, but he seems to have experienced what is called Hematidrosis. Although very rare, it can be brought on by extreme stress. Leonardo da Vinci reported witnessing it occur in a soldier just before battle. There have been cases of it in those awaiting execution and also one during the blitz in London in 1940. What is clear is that Jesus suffered an immense interior trial before ever his physical torture began. The Passion began in his heart. It was the moment in which he freely chose to take our sinful history into his immaculate Person, so as to pay the debt which we were unable to wipe out on our own.

In those dark hours of anguish just before his arrest, he asked his friends for the only favour he ever requested of them: "Could you not watch one hour with me?" (Matthew 26:40) He desired the consolation of their friendship, expressed in the form of staying awake to pray in solidarity with him. It doesn't seem a lot to ask, but they didn't even manage to do that much for him. He repeated his request several times, but in vain. This Thursday evening, we will have the opportunity to keep watch with the Lord until midnight as a gesture of love to try to make up for what his first friends failed to do in Gethsemane.

Jesus also told them in that hour of darkness that if they stayed awake to pray, they would avoid falling into temptation. (Matthew 26:41) Perhaps they might not have abandoned and denied him had they only done what he asked. Prayer still protects us from falling into temptation today. If you struggle to remain in a state of grace, a healing remedy is to increase your daily prayer time so that your

soul will grow stronger and more faithful to Christ. I finish with a line from Fulton Sheen's book, *Characters of the Passion*: "No soul ever fell away from God without giving up prayer. Prayer establishes contact with Divine Power. However dark the way, when we pray, temptation can never master us. The first step downward in the average soul is the giving up of the practice of prayer, the breaking of the circuit with divinity, and the proclamation of one's own self-sufficiency."
