Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In the second reading this Sunday, we are given a little glimpse into the life of heaven. It is a life of worship and adoration. The book of Revelation - also known as the Apocalypse - is often misunderstood. The word Apocalypse in Greek means "to remove the veil." It is a book which unveils, among other things, what will happen at the end of time, as the struggles and sorrows of earthly history finally give way to a new creation in which evil and pain will exist no more. The difficult parts of the book leading up to this happy ending depict the birth-pangs by which this renewal will come about. The book also shows us what is already happening in heaven for the souls who have been counted worthy to enter into it. It often uses symbolic language which cannot be taken literally. It begins with Jesus dressed as High Priest ministering in the Temple. This is symbolic for the fact that in heaven the liturgical worship begun on earth continues and reaches its climax. Jesus intercedes before the Father in order to open up to every generation the possibility of eternal life. We join ourselves to Christ's prayer and self-offering through the mystery of the Mass. We are in some sense already reaching "behind the veil" every time we draw near to the altar.

As well as interceding for his brothers and sisters as High Priest, Jesus is also worshipped by the saints in heaven, since he is divine as well as human. This week's second reading shows the worship of God the Father on his heavenly throne, as well as the worship of the Lamb of God. The elders and all the creatures of heaven fall prostrate before Jesus in awe-filled adoration. This worship of the Lamb is also made possible for us in a special way through the Mass. We are already prostrate before the same Lamb of God, now unveiled in glory in heaven and who is made present to us with his glory hidden behind the Eucharistic veil. The famous painting of Raphael known as the *Disputa* depicts this beautifully. We see the saints in heaven adoring the glorious Lord Jesus, while Christians on earth are gathered around the same Lord Jesus, hidden in the Blessed Sacrament.

All of this shows the importance of cultivating a spirit of adoration and worship of the Eucharistic Lord while still on earth. If people are not able to faithfully give to God at least one hour for worship on Sunday - out of the 168 hours in the week - then they are certainly far from ready to enter into the life of adoration of the saints in glory. It would be presumptuous to think that we will go straight to heaven when we die if we have not prepared our souls for what happens there.
