Holy Rosary: An Icon of Faith, Hope and Charity

The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7). Over the coming weeks we will look at the history of the Holy Rosary and explore it's meaning as an Icon of Faith, Hope and Charity.

As we analyse the history of the Church, there are many achievements of the Holy Rosary. One of the major accounts is that of Alan De La Roche, a Dominican priest, in the fifteenth century. Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206, after he had been praying and doing severe penance because of his lack of success in combating the *Albigehsian* heresy. (The most vibrant heresy in Europe and also known as *Catharism* which teaches that the universe was a battleground between good, which was spirit, and evil, which was matter. Human beings were believed to be spirits trapped in physical bodies). Mary praised him for his vigilant fight against the heretic and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explaining its use and efficacy and told him to preach it to others. In ecclesial history we can find numerous similar accounts of the triumph of the Holy Rosary.

Holy Rosary an Act of Faith: The Holy Rosary is Christo-centric in its settings and it explains the entire life of Christ, his passion, death, resurrection, and glory of the economy of salvation. Of course, the Rosary honours and contemplates Mary because the mission Mary received was from God, and her life was mostly clothed with the mysteries of Christ. Reciting the decades of the Rosary, and meditating on the cycles of joyful, sorrowful, glorious, and luminous mysteries,

makes the Rosary not only a Breviary or summary of the Gospel and of Christian life, but also a compendium of the liturgical year. Herewith, the Rosary stands as a dynamic teacher and it nurtures the Christian faith, morality, spiritual perfection, fostering various ways of faith, hope, and charity. As it was stated by Pope emeritus Benedict XVI, the Holy Rosary is an experience of a new springtime in our Christian life. When we recite the Rosary, the important and meaningful moments of salvation history are re-lived. The various steps of Christ's missions are traced through the contemplation and meditation of Holy Rosary. When we recite the Rosary, Christ is put at the centre of our life, of our time and space. When we recite the Rosary in an authentic and profound way, not mechanical and superficial, it brings peace and reconciliation, and it contains itself the healing power of the Most Holy Name of Jesus. In this way the recitation of the mysteries of Rosary becomes an act of faith. Fr. Louis
