Prayerful Greetings to you all. This week we celebrate the life of our elderly parishioners and also those who are grandparents. This celebration is to acknowledge that old age is not a disease but it is a privileged time and a time of grace in our life. The Elderly and grandparents are the prayer units of the Church and longevity, according to the Biblical tradition, is a blessing. Discarding the elderly is equal to the betrayal of humanity. Therefore, we acknowledge their wisdom and memory and we respect their history and experience in their life.

The Catholic Church has a great history of accompanying elderly people. The Social Teaching of the Church gives priority to the old age and considers that the character of old age is a gift. However, in our modern "use and throw away culture" old age is not always respected and esteemed as it should be. There is an attitude among some that values only youth, physical vigour, usefulness and productivity. Such an attitude is contrary to the Gospel and the teaching of the Church. The elderly must never be marginalized or neglected. The commandment of love includes generous attention to the elderly in our families and communities. Respect for the elderly is an essential part of our faith. It falls within the fourth commandment: *Honour your father and your mother. St.* John Paul II reminds us that *honouring older people involves a threefold duty: welcoming them, helping them and making good use of their qualities.*

The proportion of elderly in the population is rapidly increasing both nationally and globally because of technological, economic, social and cultural factors, as well as the declining birth rate and increasing life expectancy. So we need to give more respect, care and protection to our elderly people because they are our role models. They are the real witnesses of success in their life by hard work, rest on holidays, go to bed early, constant prayer and respect, and love of God. There is a special blessing for all elderly/grandparents at our Mass today. *Fr. Louis*
